## MINUTES OF A SPECIAL MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE PUEBLO CONSERVANCY DISTRICT January 13, 1940.

A special meeting of the Board of Directors of The Pueblo Conservancy District was held at 2 P.M. January 13, 1940 in the office of Mr. Holmes.

Directors present: John M. Holmes, president; W. T. Mathis and Frank Pryor Jr. Bert L. Beatty, City Commissioner; Charles K. Rose, City Attorney; Si Elliot and Roy Longworth, City Engineers; and Terry Owens of the W. P. A. were also present.

Further discussion was had on the repairs and work to be done at South end of Union Avenue Viaduct and the attached agreement was signed and delivered to Mr. Beatty of the City of Pueblo after being read and explained to those present. The plans for this work were looked over with approval of same delayed until they are remade to include the extended work up the river bank. Motion was made by Mr. Mathis and seconded by Mr. Pryor that the agreement be signed by the District.

Mr. Owens wanted to know how the work would proceed with both City and Conservancy District interested and was told the City would be responsible for buying and giving instructions on the work, the Conservancy District being interested only in its agreed payment of \$25,000 cash or materials, or service as set forth in the agreement.

It was agreed among the members of the Conservancy District Board that John M. Holmes was directed to work with the various agencies on this project and had full authority to decide any matters involving the Board on purchase of materials, etc. and that reasonable compensation be paid for such services by the District.

The project for riprapping of outside of the levees through the City was brought up again and it was thought advisable to sign the papers necessary for presentation of this project to Washington for approval of the project, there being no obligation on the District at this time to go through with the project even if it is approved in Washington. Mr. Pryor moved and Mr. Mathis seconded the motion that Mr. Holmes sign these preliminary papers for presentation in Washington by the City of Pueblo.

Copies of the annual cash statement to the District Judge Leddy were passed around the motion was made by Mr. Pryor, seconded by Mr. Mathis that these statements be approved and submitted to Judge Leddy.

Minutes of meetings of March 8, 1939 and September 28, 1939 were read, and upon motion approved.

AGREEMENT

This Agreement made this 13 day of January in the year of our Lord One Thousand Nine Hundred and Forty, between Pueblo, a Municipal Corporation, as Party of the First Part, and, The Pueblo Conservancy District, a Political Subdivision, as Party of the Second Part, WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, the Party of the First Part is contemplating changes and repairs to the south end of the Union Avenue Viaduct which extends over the new river channel and the railroad tracks in front of the Pueblo Union Depot, and it is of advantage and expedient in connection with such project for said work to further protect the embankment of the new river channel adjacent to the south end of said viaduct and the Party of the Second Part is an interested and proper party with reference to such additional work

NOW, THEREFORE, it is hereby agreed by and between the parties hereto that for and in consideration of the party of the first part sponsoring a W. P. A. Project to make said repairs, and, performing all the necessary Engineering Work and Supervision of said repairs and construction in conjunction with repairing the bank at the south end of said viaduct, the party of the Second Part hereby agrees to allow the W. P. A. Project as sponsored by the Party of the First Part to enter into the River Channel to perform the necessary work and make necessary repairs appertaining thereto.

The Party of the Second Part further agrees to pay the Sponsor's share of the contribution as outlined in the W. P. A. Proposal to be submitted by the Party of the First Part to the W. P. A. in an amount not to exceed Twenty-five Thousand Dollars (\$25,000.00) in cash, materials or services, to be paid whenever the same shall be required by the progress of the work.

It is further agreed that the plans and designs for all the work aforesaid shall be subject to the approval of The Pueblo Conservancy District and the work to be done under said plans shall be subject to the inspection and approval of The Pueblo Conservancy District.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Party of the First Part has hereunto caused this agreement to be executed and signed by Bert L. Beaty as President of the City Council, and Mary E. Weaver as City Clerk, and the party of the Second Part has caused this instrument to be executed and signed by John M. Holmes, its President, and Winifred Cross, its Secretary, on the day and year first above written.


