

MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE PUEBLO CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

January 15, 1935

A meeting of the Board of Directors of The Pueblo Conservancy District was held in the office of the District at 3:30 P.M. January 15, 1935.

The meeting was called to order by John M. Holmes, president of the District.
Directors present: Holmes; Mathis and Pryor.

The minutes of the meeting of November 28, 1934, were read, and upon motion, approved.

Mr. Holmes reported that he had again been out to the Barrier at Rock Canyon and that the rock had been replaced on the earth fill about as well as could be done with the kind of rock used.

The following letter from the City of Pueblo was read in reply to letter copy of which is in minutes of November 28, 1934.

December 5, 1934

Dear Sir:

Mr. J. W. Carpenter, Commissioner of Finance, advises me that you desire a letter from the Commissioners concerning tax levy for the year 1935 for Conservancy District purposes.

It is my understanding that the substance of your request is that the Commissioners make a statement as to the reason for not raising this levy to cover the full assessment due in 1935 as well as present assessments which are in arrears.

The general tax situation, which was so thoroughly discussed and gone into by various organizations at the time the annual levy ordinance was introduced

seems to the Commissioners to be a full and complete explanation of this matter and that there is nothing that they can add to the general public understanding of this matter.

In line with this matter Mr. Holmes dictated the following letter to Judge John H. Voorhees to keep him posted as to the City's delinquency and have the benefit of any recommendations he might wish to give the Board.

January 16, 1935

Honorable John H. Voorhees,
Judge, Tenth Judicial District,
City.

My dear Sir:

As it is under your division of the Court that the Pueblo Conservancy District operates, we desire to call your attention to the fact that the City of Pueblo is delinquent in its payment of taxes to the Pueblo Conservancy District as of December 31, 1934 \$89,259.71. The Board of Directors have taken up with the City Commissioners and written them on various occasions; have also taken up with the City Attorney regarding an additional tax levy or assessment to take care of the city's delinquency. The City Commissioners declined to make the additional assessment. We refer you to the shrinkage of the Conservancy District surplus which is quite largely due to the City of Pueblo's failure to pay.

We call this to your attention and ask for your recommendation in the matter.

J. G. Harvey submitted a proposal for a payment of \$150.00 for the portions of lots which the District owns on the west side of both north and south approaches to the Santa Fe Avenue bridge. It was decided to tell Mr. Harvey that the amount involved is so small that the District does not feel like going to the expense of having a survey made to ascertain just what portions of lots are saleable but if Mr. Harvey wishes to go to the expense of having a survey made, the Board will be willing to talk about the proposition at that time. At the present time the Board could not sell not knowing just what portions are in the roadway of the City or on the bridge approaches.

Mr. Fryor made a motion that the Board of Directors ratify action taken by Mr. Holmes on December 14, 1934, in accepting \$180.02 in full settlement of
