Mr. Holmes called attention to a news item in the Star Journal of October 1, 1945, regarding the City of Pueblo appropriation fund figures for the year 1946. The article stated that the proposed levy for raising funds to pay the City's annual installment to the Conservancy District was 5.5 mills. Mr. Holmes expressed dissatisfaction because this levy had been lowered from the 1945 figure of 5.75 mills. The subject was discussed at length and figures pertaining to the amount the City is in arrears in payments, the amount which might be realized under the proposed levy of 5.5 mills, etc., were examined. It was the concensus of opinion of the Directors that instead of cutting from 5.75 mills to 5.50 mills, the levy should have been raised to 6.00 mills in order to reduce the delinquent balance due from the City to the Conservancy District more rapidly.

Mr. Pryor made a motion which was seconded by Mr. Mathis and upon note carried, to the effect that Mr. Greene prepare a statement showing the present status of the balance due the District from the City and also the amount due each year since 1925 and the amount paid each year, and that Mr. Holmes and Mr. Greene take this statement to the City Commissioners and ask that the mill levy for 1945 be 6.00 mills instead of the proposed levy of 5.5 mills in order that the delinquent balance due from the City be paid more rapidly.
