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A copy of Turner S. Underwood's audit for the period June 1, 1948 to May 31, 1949, was handed to each Director and Mr. Holmes called attention to items of special interest.

Mr. Holmes reported that the South Colorado Power Company had requested an Easement on a pole line location extending from the Fourth Street viaduct to West Eleventh Street at Dry Creek. The Power Company had submitted the Grant of Easement for approval and a sketch showing the location of the land on which the Easement was desired. Mr. Holmes stated this sketch had been submitted to S. F. Elliot, Engineer for the Bistrict, and Elliot had reported that granting the Easement would not have any adverse effect on Conservancy District flood protection works. Mr. Holmes recommended that the Easement be granted and requested a motion to that effect. Whereupon Mr. Mathis made a motion which was seconded by Mr, Pryor and unanimously carried. Copy of the Easement is attached hereto and made a part hereof.

Mf. Holmes reported that the plan of the Santa Fe Railway Company for draining their new freight yard called for a large drainage ditch on Fifteenth Street from Dry Creek east to beyond the Santa Fe tracks. This Ditch will have to cut a backwater levee constructed by the District across Fifteenth Street. Mr. Holmes reported he and Mr. Greene with S. F. Elliot had gone to Fifteenth Street with William Clark, Engineer for the Santa Fe Railway Company, and had discussed the problem of how the Santa Fe could accomplish what they wanted to accomplish without making a change in the Conservancy District levee which would be detrimental to the District. Mr. Holmes explained a proposalmade by the Santa Fe which appeared to be satisfactory, whereupon Mr. Mathis moved that Holmes and Greene be authorized to deal with the Santa Fe. Mr. Pryor seconded the motion which was passed.

Greene reported that in due course after Rose and Seavy had orally argued the Florman case before the Colorado Supreme Court, the Court upheld Judge Leddy's decision to the effect that inasmuch as the Florman title originated from a County Tax Title, the Conservancy taxes were invalid. Greene said that Rose asked the Court for a rehaearing and on October 10, 1949, the rehearing was denied. Greene submitted to the Directors tabulation sheets showing how many of the Treasurer's Certificates of Purchase held by the District would be affected by the Court's decision. The tabulation showed the face value of all Certificates held by the District to have been on October 1st - \$119,751.89, and that it was definitely known that at least \$80,000.00 of this amount was in connection with Tax Title properties.

Holmes stated that as the cost of quieting title and thereby having a decree issued cancelling Conservancy taxes would cost a property owner upwards of \$150.00, that in some instances they would prefer to pay the District nearly this amount for effecting cancellation rather than go through title quieting proceedings. The directors on motion by Mr. Pryor and seconded by Mr. Mathis authorized Holmes and Greene to make compromise settlements in cases of this kind as they saw fit.

Mr. Pryor moved and Mr. Mathis seconded the motion which was unanimously passed approving the purchase on October 7th of Tax D. Bonds in the amount of \$100,000.00.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
