

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF
THE PUEBLO CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

December 26, 1923.

The regular weekly meeting of the Board of Directors of the Pueblo Conservancy District was held in the office of the District, Room 740 Thatcher Block at 10:30 A.M. December 26, 1923. The meeting was called to order and presided over by Chas. W. Lee, president of the District. Directors present: Lee, Raber, Nuckolls. Directors absent: none. The minutes of the meeting of December 17, 1923, were read, and upon motion, approved.

Mr. Nuckolls introduced the following resolution and moved its adoption:

BE IT RESOLVED that pursuant to advertisement for bids for construction work, the following bid form be and the same is hereby adopted and approved, to-wit:

Pursuant to the Advertisement of your Board published December 19, 1923, for bids for the construction named and itemized on page 2 of this proposal as designated in said Advertisement and in the specifications and contract drawings of the District; the undersigned bidder herewith proposes to do all work, perform all services, and furnish all materials (unless otherwise definitely provided in the specifications or on the contract drawings) at the unit prices named in the following schedule, within the time, at the progress rate, and in

the manner required, all in accordance with the specifications for said work contained in the book entitled, "Contract Forms and Specifications," issued by The Pueblo Conservancy District and the drawings hereinafter designated; and agrees to execute a valid agreement and to furnish a satisfactory bond, such agreement and bond to form integral parts of the Contract consisting of advertisement, agreement, bond, specifications and drawings.

The bidder further agrees that in case of his failure to execute such agreement and furnish necessary bond, within the time fixed in the Advertisement, the check accompanying this proposal, and the money payable thereon, shall be and remain the property of The Pueblo Conservancy District, as liquidated damages for such failure.

The bidder further agrees that, in case the work is awarded to him, he will begin, prosecute and complete the work as required in the Schedule of Progress given on page 2 of this Proposal; and that in prosecuting the work he will maintain the rate of progress required, as provided in Section 0.3 of the Specifications, entitled Time and Order of Completion.

This proposal is conditioned on the award being made, and the work being financed and ready to proceed, on or before February 15, 1924, unless by the agreement of both parties this proposal is held binding for a longer period.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Raber. Chairman Lee put the motion to a vote resulting as follows:

Ayes: Lee, Raber, Nuckolls. Nays: none. Thereupon the Chairman declared the motion duly passed.

Mr. Lee stated that Mr. Jones had reported that the D. & R. G. W. Railroad had offered to donate the remaining portion of the steel bridge which crosses the Fountain River on First Street, to the Pueblo Conservancy District provided the District would pay for dismantling the same. Mr. Jones stated that the D. & R. G. W. RR had offered to dismantle it at cost, the estimate of which was \$1300, Crocker's estimate being \$1500. Upon motion of Mr. Nuckolls the matter was left in the hands of Chairman Lee to act in conjunction with the Chief Engineer.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion, adjourned.
