MINUTES OF A MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

of

THE PUEBLO CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

May 23, 1945

A meeting of the Board of Directors of The Pueblo Conservancy District was held at 2:30 P.M. May 23, 1945 in the office of the District, 207 Colorado Building.

Directors present: John M. Holmes, W. T. Mathis and Frank Pryor Jr. Also present at the meeting was Elbert D. Greene. The meeting was called to order and presided over by John M. Holmes, president of the District

Minutes of the meeting of September 25, 1944 were read and upon motion by W. T. Mathis seconded by Frank Pryor Jr., approved as read.

Mr. Holmes reported that the slag at bottom of the Union Avenue Viaduct south side repair cannot be pulled back up and used according to Arthur Allen. That Mr. Allen thinks it should just be spread out on the bottom of the river to keep from obstructing the flow of water.

It was reported by the Secretary that the lease of Arthur & Allen on the land at the Rock Canyon Barrier expires as of May 1, 1946. They wished to have all their leases expire at one time so paid - in addition to the \$120.00 due from May 1, 1945 to May 1, 1946 an additional \$80.00 to pay their rent up to Dec. 31, 1946 which is the expiration date of other leases they have.

Report was made by Mr. Holmes that a Mr. R. N. Wade was trespassing on land in the river bottom just west of the West 4th St. bridge and that Mr. Rose had been instructed to write a letter asking Mr. Wade to vacate that land as of June 15th. (Copy of letter attached hereto.)

Mr. Holmes announced that bonds of J. E. Creel for the 1945-1947 term had been placed as follows:

making the total of the \$50,000.00 bond on the County Treasurer to the Pueblo Conservancy District.

Mr. Holmes then stated he wanted to make record of the following: In October, 1944 a meeting (not of record) had been held in his office by the Board of Directors at which time plans were gone over with the government engineers prior to a contract-letting for the repairs to the levee and sewer just west of the Santa Fe Avenue highway bridge. The plans were agreed upon by the government engineers, Mr. Studinski of the City of Pueblo and the Board of Directors of The District. That on November 2, 1944 a meeting was held in his office at which time the formal contract with the government was signed and plans received final approval and a check given to the Government in the amount of \$7630.02 as the then estimated cost of the cities' and district's part of the construction costs of the project estimated to be approximately \$16,000.00

Since that time the Board of Directors had paid a visit to the work after it was finished and had accepted the project.

Dear Sir:

You are now occupying as a trespasser lands in the official channel of the Arkansas River owned by the Pueblo Conservancy District; such lands being on the South side of the river and West of the 4th Street bridge and part of the Northerly portion of Block C, Corona Park, together with vacated D & R G right-of-way owned by the Conservancy District.

You are hereby ordered and directed to vacate said property immediately and to remove not only all of your personal property therefrom but also any improvements that you have erected, and unless you do so on or before June 15th legal action will be taken by the District accordingly. Nothing in this letter is to be construed as confirming in you any right whatsoever in such land or improvements thereon or as a waiver of any trespass.

That a meeting with Engineers Cole and Calkins of Albuquerque had been held in May by John M. Holmes when he took them to the Barrier site to make inspections and look the situation over as to a reservoir site or location.

That another meeting had been held May 11, 1945 in Mr. Holmes office at which time it was decided to make a change in the office, following which Meeting Mrs. Cross was to be written that her services were terminating- letter follows:

May 11, 1945

Dear Mrs. Cross:

At a special meeting of the Board of Directors of The Pueblo Conservancy District held this date, it was decided to instruct Attorney Charles M. Rose to start action on which we termed Bernstein Property and also the Midland Hotel Property. He is also requested to contact a squatter on the south bank of the Arkansas River between the Pueblo Water Works and the 4th Street bridge to see what right that party has to occupying the property.

It was also decided at this meeting that certain changes in the setup of The Pueblo Conservancy District were felt to be necessary.

- 1: For the economical operation of the District
- 2: For the future activity of Tax Collections
- 3: On account of activity of Water Transversion and future work of inspection, repairs, construction, and work on the levees and barriers, it was felt that changes should be made.

Therefore, we felt that for the above reasons that it is best that we make the following changes effective as of July 1st.

The offices which we do not use in the Colorado Building will be discontinued and it will be the duty of the present secretary to so notify the proper authorities that the Conservancy District will vacate their office as of July 1st.

Due to the feeling that we have of our requirements covering the above mentioned, we feel that it is necessary that we employ a secretary who is familiar with real estate, its values, and its tax problems; one who will be capable of aiding the board in looking after much of the work that must be done in the inspection and construction work and repairs of levees and barriers.

Therefore, a new secretary will be appointed as of July 1st. The present secretary will be notified at an early date the name of the secretary. It is the request that the present secretary shall make all the information and records available to the one to be newly appointed so that the transfer may be made with little or no difficulty.

It is expected that the new appointee shall be given all information and shall have to him properly explained all of the operating details of the secretary's office of The Pueblo Conservancy District.

Mr. Holmes was asked to sign cancellation of bonds of Secretary and Treasurer as of May 31st. There being no further business to come before the meeting, it was, upon motion, adjourned.
