Mr. Holmes reported that he had gone with Mr. Greene and Mr. Elliot to the City Hall and conferred with Commissioners Beaty, Klipfel and Morse regarding the levee reapirs at the south end of the Union Avenue viaduct. It was agreed at this meeting that these repairs were largely the responsibility of The Conservancy District and that the City should pay only the cost of replacing and repairing of those items which were definitely the City's responsibility. Attached hereto is a Resolution passed by the City Council authorizing the District to have the repairs made and bill the City for its part. Simon F. Elliot advises the District that the City's part of this work amounts to \$344.44 and the District is accordingly billing the City for this amount.

Mr. Holmes read a letter from P. N. Wiggins, Jr., regarding an oil lease on property owned by the District near the Rock Canon Dam, the property being in Section 36, Tns. 20 S, R. 66 W., Pueblo County.

## RESOLUTION

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PUEBLO:

That repair work should be started on the south bank of the Arkansas River adjacent to the abutment of the Union Avenue Viaduct, specifically on the down river side or to the east of the abutment.

Inasmuch as this work is largely the responsibility of the Flood Conservancy District and our responsibility lies in certain drainage through this bank, the Council hereby authorizes and directs the Flood Conservancy District to proceed with this work, as well as a barrier fence at the intake pipe on Water Street and to bill the City with its pro-rata share of the expense.

Mr. Holmes stated that it was his opinion that it would be desirable to enter into the lease:

- (1) If Mr. Rose gave an affirmative opinion as to the legality of the Officers of the District negotiating the lease.
- (2) If Mr. Rose approved the form of lease submitted.
- (3) If the consideration named in the lease was fair.

Mr. Pryor moved and Mr. Methis seconded a motion which was unanimously carried authorizing the President and Secretary to negotiate the lease providing after investigation it appeared advisable to do so.

Mr. Mathis said, in view of the fact that Mr. Holmes had given so much time to the affairs of the District in connection with the levee repair work being done by the Hanes Construction Co., and the work being done by the Blackburn Engineering Co., that he thought it fair that Mr. Holmes should be compensated for what he had done. Mr. Holmes said that he was not asking for any remuneration but if the other Directors cared to take action in the matter, he would leave it to their judgment. Mr. Holmes excused himself from the meeting and the other two Directors discussed the matter, commenting on the fact that Mr. Holmes made frequent inspections of the repair work and consulted on many occasions with the contractor. Mr. Mathis and Mr. Pryor agreed that Mr. Holmes should be compensated, and therefore passed a motion to the effect that compensation be fixed at the lump sum figure of \$400.00. This figure was arrived at by taking into consideration the fact that the advertising for bids for the job Hanes is doing started on April first and it will be approximately four months from April first to the completion of the two jobs; - the \$400.00 figure being four months at \$100.00 per month.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
