Mr. Banner,

I'm reaching out to you on behalf of FEMA Region VIII employee, David Sutley, who was asked to participate in an upcoming court hearing involving the Pueblo Conservancy District Maintenance Fund Assessment.

FEMA and the Department of Homeland Security's (DHS) regulations restrict federal employees from providing testimony in private third-party litigation. With regard to testimony, FEMA's regulations at 44 CFR § 5.87(a) state:

No FEMA employee shall testify in response to a subpoena or other demand in private litigation as to any information relating to material contained in the files of the Agency, or any information acquired as part of the performance of that person's official duties or because of that person's official status, including the meaning of Agency documents.

The Chief Counsel for the Agency can only provide a waiver upon a determination that participation is necessary to promote a *significant interest of the agency* or other good cause. 5 CFR § 5.89. This is a very high standard and rarely done. Similarly, DHS's regulations, located at 6 CFR 5.44(a) provide that:

[n]o employee . . . of the Department shall, in response to a demand or request, including in connection with any litigation, provide oral or written testimony by deposition, declaration, affidavit, or otherwise concerning any information acquired while such person is or was an employee of the Department as part of the performance of that person's official duties . . . unless authorized to do so by the Office of General Counsel

The regulations were crafted to maintain strict impartiality with respect to private litigants/matters and to preserve human resources for performing official agency functions. Based upon the forgoing, David cannot provide the requested testimony or participate in the hearing.

The Region can, however, continue to provide technical assistance with respect to levee certification requirements.
