

MINUTES OF THE REGULAR MEETING OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS
OF THE PUEBLO CONSERVANCY DISTRICT

April 29, 1924.

The regular weekly meeting of the Board of Directors of The Pueblo Conservancy District was held in the office of the District, Room 740 Thatcher Building at 10 A. M. April 29, 1924. The meeting was called to order and presided over by Chas. W. Lee, president of the District.

Directors present: Lee; Nuckolls; Reber.

Directors absent: none.

The minutes of the meeting of April 22, 1924, were read, and upon motion, approved.

Mr. Reber moved that the communication from the Colorado Fuel & Iron Company of April 23, 1924, signed by Thomas Aurelius relative to price of reinforcing steel, be received, filed and spread upon the minutes; that the offer contained in said letter be accepted and purchase of steel be made on that basis until further action of this Board. The maximum price as per said communication to be on the basis of \$3.10 per hundred weight f.o.b. Pueblo for plain or round squares or deformed round and squares less 25¢ per hundredweight.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Nuckolls. The Chairman put the motion to a vote resulting as follows:

Gentlemen:

In conversation with Mr. Lee this morning - we agree to furnish you with concrete reinforcing bars for all of the work required by the District; said bars to be made from new billet steel of intermediate or structural grade to the extent of your requirements, on the uniform basis of 25¢ per 100 lbs. base, less than quoted by this company for like material to its regular trade; said price to be on carloads delivered at Pueblo, Colorado or for less than carloads at the mill - you to do the hauling - or in less than carloads if the material is loaded in cars and delivered to Pueblo. These prices are for square or round steel of stock lengths and for deformed square or rounds of equivalent area but for twisted squares the differential under that quoted to our regular customers will be only 12½¢ per 100 lbs. As an example; on this basis our price today is \$3.10 f.o.b. Pueblo from which, for plain or round squares or deformed round and squares, you would deduct 25 cents per 100 lbs., making a net base price of \$2.85 for the above material. For twisted squares the net base price would be \$2.97½ per 100 lbs.

These figures do not contemplate other than stock lengths of 20, 40, or 60 feet. Extras for sizes smaller than base sizes are shown in the attached pamphlet. Any cutting to length other than 20, 40 or 60 feet would take the cutting extras as shown in the attached booklet.

We agree to furnish and delivery material in carloads f.o.b. Pueblo in kind and quantity designated by the purchaser from time to time, upon two weeks' notice, and agree that the above prices are guaranteed, and in case of any decline in the market, price as outlined above will be reflected in the price to you.

Pueblo, Colorado in carloads; until further action of this Board.

Gentlemen:

We agree to furnish your District tie plates, angle bars, track spikes, and track bolts at a uniform differential of twenty-five cents (25¢) per hundred pounds under our regular quotations to customers buying like materials, - all prices to be made f. o. b. Pueblo, Colorado in carloads.

I do not know what the quantities of these materials may be but this basis of price is satisfactory to us and I believe will be perfectly agreeable to you. If so, please let me know.
